OPEN PAIRS

It was an exciting and a very satisfying beginning in the Pairs Tournament with a record 176 Pairs participating.

These pairs went through two grueling eliminations of two sessions (each of 20 boards). In the first elimination 144 Pairs (excluding the qualified pairs for the T-4 event) participated. They were put in Six sections of 12 NS & 12 EW, and after playing 2 sessions of 20 boards each, 60 qualified Pairs went through to the 2nd elimination round and were joined by 12 losing quarter finalists. In the 2nd elimination the 72 pairs were put into 3 sections. And again played a 2 session, 20 boards each elimination round out of which, the best 26 pairs qualified for the Pairs Finals. They will be joined by the six losing semi-finalists pairs, to constitute the final 32 for today's exciting FINALS.




