"SHREE CEMENT" Team from Kolkata Leads after 6 Rounds in Team of Four

The Tournament started yesterday with the Team of Four event for the **"Naresh Tandan Trophy"**. As expected the response to the tournament was excellent with **72 teams** from all parts of India along with GIANTS team from Karachi, Pakistan participating in the Team of Four event. The Indian OPEN, SENIOR & YOUTH teams bound for Beijing, China for the 1st Mind Sports Games in October, are also participating in the tournament and using this opportunity to sharpen their skills playing against some TOP Indian teams.

Texan Aces, Dhampur Sugar Mills, Formidables, Tolani Shipping, J.P. Goenka, Shree Cement, Wellknit, Sunil Machhar and Maya Meera Sneha are some of the top Indian teams participating.

At the end of first day (after 6 rounds), **SHREE CEMENT**, comprising of Manas Mukherjee, Rana Roy, Subroto Saha, Subir Majumder, Vibash Todi & S. Lahiri lead the event with **124 VPs**. They beat Merrut Blue by 25-0 (1st Round), Transparent, Pune by 19-11 (2nd round), lost 14-16 to Maya Meera Sneha in the 3rd round, won by 24-6 against Spartans in the 4th round, won by 23-7 against Punjab Bridge Association in the 5th round and beat Alok Daga by 19-11 in the 6th round to take the day's top honours.

MAYA MEERA SNEHA (Vijay Goel, Sukamal Das, Ashim Mukherjee, Yuu Rong, C.S. Mazumder, Samir Basak) are in the second place with **122 VPs**. **DHAMPUR SUGAR MILLS & ARUN JAIN** (117), **RAJJAN**, Allahabad (115), Texan Aces & Alok Dahga (111), Formidables & Sunil Machhar (107) are holding the 3rd to 9th positions respectively.

Today it is going to be far more competitive as teams lagging behind will try to catch up for the Quarter Final berths. There will be 4 more rounds before the Quarter Finalists are identified. The top teams requiring some extra work to do today are **PADDAR DEVELOPERS** (104 VPs), **INDIA SENIORS** (103 VPs), **KHANDELWALS** (102 VPs), **WELLKNIT** (99 VPs), **J.P. GOENKA** (97) & **TOLANI SHIPPING** (91 VPs).

The quarter-finals will be live on BBO.

The OPEN PAIRS event starts today evening and a large number of entries are expected in the Pair event also, considering the large participation in the Teams event.

The first elimination will consist of 2 sessions of 20/22 boards. The participants will play in 6 sections.

TRANSFER – THE FUTURE (Part 2)

As discussed in the first bulletin, use of transfers is becoming very popular day by day. One of the best use of transfers is over 1C Opening Bid whether Natural 1C or Artificial Strong 1C.

Transfer Responses after 1C Opening Bid

Transfer positive responses over strong Artificial 1C are used by many experts as they can make stronger hand declarer. Transfer responses over Standard 1C have been around only for few years and are becoming very popular among experts. The main advantage of transfer responses is that when opener accepts the transfer he shows 12-14 HCP hand and therefore 1NT rebid shows 17(18)-19 HCP hand.

Tit-bits from the Day's Play

Players did not respond to the request of sending some good hands to the Editor. But, there were few interesting happenings on few of the tables.

In round-1, the Editor watched a team bidding an uncontested Grand Slam. From the first bid to the "Ace asking Blackwood" by the bidding team the opponents were silent spectators. However, after all the ACES & KINGS were found and their opponents reached the 7H contract, the opponents DOUBLED and it went 6 down for 1700. Those of you thinking how your other friends get 25-0 score, this was a perfect example of first round hiccups, when poor partners are playing after long time. The usual culprit in this case was 5D answer to 4NT. One partner considered it to be 1-4, whereas the other was considering it to be 0-3. He calculated it to be 3 and he had 1, so all the ACES were in place.

Usually not many players like to play the MINOR-SUIT slams. But there was one here in round -5.

1NT was 15-16 and the declarer received a low club lead. Declarer put small from dummy and the trick was won by 9, when East preferred inserting the club 8. The diamonds were tested and after the bad-break, declarer played the TOP spade, ruffed a spade, cashed the top clubs and played the HJ from dummy. This was covered by King and now a low heart was ruffed in dummy and another spade ruffed with D10. When the trick held, the declarer was through. He gave the only diamond scoring his slam.
