### "SURBHI" Team Leads after 6 Rounds in Team of Four Event

The Tournament started yesterday with the Team of Four event for the "Naresh Tandan Trophy". 77 teams - including one team from Bangladesh, were seen in action in the the Team of Four event.

Texan Aces, Dhampur Sugar Mills, Formidables, Shree Cement, Poddar Developers, Promila Saraf, Hemant K. Jalan, Arun Jain, Manyavar, Khandelwal, Azure and Maya Meera Sneha are some of the top Indian teams participating.

At the end of first day (after 6 rounds), **SURBHI**, comprising of Col. Guriqbal Singh, Sant Sharma, Ravi Kumar, Col. Sohan Pal, Buddy Shah and Rahul Shetty lead the event with **120 VPs. Dhampur Sugar Mills** (Ashok Goel, Suhas Vaidya, Pritish Kushari, Debbrata Majumder, Sumit Mukherjee and Bhabesh Saha) & **Maharaja** (Kalyan Choudhary, Kalyan Nandi, A. Kundan, S.R. Bhattacharya, S. Some and S. Das) are in joint second place with **119 VPs.** Formidables (116) is in 4<sup>th</sup> place and Khandelwal is in 5<sup>th</sup> place with 113 VPs. Spartans (108) and Azure (107) are in 6<sup>th</sup> & 7<sup>th</sup> place & with a score of 105 VPs, the 8<sup>th</sup> place is shared by Elusive 52 and Sham Sharma teams.

Today it is going to be far more competitive as teams lagging behind will try to catch up for the Quarter Final berths. There will be 4 more rounds before the Quarter Finalists are identified. The top teams lagging behind are Promila Saraf and Maya Meera Sneha with 103 VPs, Poddar Developers, Texan Aces and Arun Jain with 100 VPs. Manyavar (90), Hemant Jalan (87) & Shree Cement (85) will have to do exceptionally well for a berth in last-8.

The top 8 teams will qualify for the 3\*12 board quarter-finals. 2 sessions of the quarter-finals will be played today evening and will be on BBO.

The OPEN PAIRS event starts today evening and considering the large participation in the Teams event, a real large number of entries are expected in the Pair event also.

The first elimination will consist of 2 sessions of 20/22 boards. The participants will play in 6 sections. The first session of elimination-I will be played today evening and the 2<sup>nd</sup> session will be played tomorrow morning.

West led a low heart ( $3^{rd}$  /  $5^{th}$ ) to Jack, King and Ace. Declarer ruffed a low heart in dummy and played the CK, getting the news of bad trump break. He now played Diamond Ace, ruffed a diamond in hand, ruffed a heart in dummy and again ruffed a diamond in hand. Now SK and 2 more rounds of top spades were played. When a low diamond was now played from dummy, East was forced to ruff. He ruffed with Jack and declarer ducked this. Poor East was forced to give the last 2 tricks to the CAT.

North's 2S was Michaels and South's 2NT was for checking the minor. West's double showed a good hand and after East doubled the 3D and South ran to 3H, West doubled again for penalty. The defence was precise and went as follows:

The singleton diamond was led to King and Ace. Club 2 was backed to CQ. CA and SA ere cashed and SJ was backed requesting for a diamond return. Declarer discarded a diamond from dummy, East ruffed and returned a diamond, declarer ruffing by 8 west overruffing with 9. Spade was returned and declarer ruffed with HK, east discarding a diamond. When declarer played HQ, West won with Ace and played another spade, thus fOrcing declarer to give the H10 to partner. The contract went 5 down for -1400.

No doubt Surbhi team is on top of the leaderboard after 6 rounds.
